The BH UK Network was set up in 1996 to provide practical and psychological support to Bosnian and other ethnic minority communities. The Committee consists of service users and service providers, including young, unemployed, elderly, vulnerable and disabled members of our community. The trustees of the organisation meet regularly to plan its affairs. Duties are executed by one full time member of staff, two part-time staff and a large pool of active volunteers. All workers and most key volunteers are fluent in both the Bosnian and English-written and spoken languages.

Main aims of the BH UK Network include improving the quality of life for over 10,000 Bosnian refugees living in the United Kingdom, who moved over amidst the Balkan Wars. This includes a population who are physically and psychologically scarred as a result of the war and many of whom are in need of Long-term on-going and consistent care. Their barriers to accessing care are complex and include issues that lack of knowledge of the English language, and both mental health and physical ill health stemming from war experiences. In practice, a very large operational call on staff time is support of elderly and their families including young carers in the

West Midlands.

The centre caters for these needs, in addition to providing social support and regular community-based activities at the Bosnia House in Birmingham. Bosnia House is accessible to all at most times during the week days and weekends alike.

The Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the BH UK Network is a well-known event amongst Bosnians. It was held in September 2019, in Bosnia House in Birmingham. This year we had the great honour that our Ambassador of Bosnia and Herzegovina based in London, His Excellency Vanja Filipovic and First Secretary, Biljana Lucic attended. Also, we had representatives of Bosnian associations from Derby, Birmingham, Coventry, Hertfordshire, BH Advisory Centre London, Victoria London and the Bosnia Appeal Humanitarian Organisation, Women’s Association from Coventry and members of the Bosnian Centre for Advice from London. HE Vanja Filipović emphasized that his priority in the coming period will be to promote Bosnian economic markets and attracting British investors to Bosnia and Herzegovina. Biljana Lucic, First Secretary, was especially

impressed by the activities of Bosnia and Herzegovina supplementary schools. We recognise the importance of many volunteers who play a vital role in the existence of the BH UK Network organisation. Over the reporting period, BH UK Network awarded “Volunteers of the Year” at the AGM ceremony in September 2019. The awards were personally presented by H.E. Vanja Filipović, Ambassador of Bosnia and Herzegovina in London. The Awards went to individuals who were doing their best to help and assist during different events/activities and to organisations who supported Bosnian community and cooperated with the BH UK Network on different projects.

Some of the highlight activities over the reporting period are: ;Continuous Drop in Services for our clients in Birmingham and Coventry, Celebration of

Independence Day and National Day of BiH; Memorial tournament in football “Irhad Rizvo Durakovic”; Marking the International Holocaust Day and organising the commemoration of the Srebrenica genocide in Birmingham and Coventry;

regular indoor sports activities for all generations at the Sports Centre Moseley College; Attending the 16th World Championship of the BiH Diaspora in futsal held in Oslo, Traditional celebration of the International Women’s Day; Organised community dinner for the staff and volunteers of “Remembering Srebrenica” organisation; Organising New Year’s party and gifts for kids; Organising New Year’s Lunch in Bosnia House for the elderly members of our community; Attending the workshops with the Dorridge Scout Group and discussing the war, pov-

erty, hatred, love and survival;

Organising trainings in Bosnia House for our citizens living in the West Midlands area related to the Mental health and living with life-limiting illnesses; Organising a World Refugee Day conference at the Bosnia House in partnership with Birmingham City Council attended by over 80 delegates from 22 different ethnic minority groups; Organising round table discussions with the ministers of the Bosnian and Herzegovina; Organising gathering of the Bosnian supplementary schools in the UK attended by over 400 children and their parents ; Hosting the creative workshops in cooperation with Birmingham City South College and Neighbourhood News online team; Supporting the research about mental health

of the Bosnian community in the UK undertaken by PhD candidates from De Montford University - Leicester; Cooperation with the Celebrating Sanctuary organisation to create unique Mural “Bosnia and Herzegovina through history” in order to educate and inspire young people; and Empowering young people to fulfil their potential, thrive and prosper through various activities.

The West Midlands project funded by Big Lottery Fund was set up as planned and brings positive change in the lives of the most disadvantaged members of our community. There are 2 staff members who are available 24/7 and offer free, independent listening, advice, advocacy and signposting services. We set up regular weekly activities including 35 hours/week of professional support to address our

beneficiaries’ needs. Recent extension of Bosnia House enables us to run parallel activities for elderly and carers. These activities encourage more isolated people to come along and use the services. We serve those most in need, those without family, friends or funds, and those who cannot care for themselves especially with their lack of English language. We set up outreach service for elderly and/or disabled members of our community that are housebound in Birmingham, Walsall, Sandwell, Wolverhampton and Coventry; We have an out of hours telephone that our outreach worker holds, so that our clients can access it 24 hours for any support; They rung in regards to their hospital appointments, their medication, transport, welfare benefits, their rent;

Our outreach worker supported with 17 volunteers provided support to housebound older members of our community providing them advice on health, social and housing issues, making phone calls on their

behalf and filling various forms; There are activities organised in St.Peters centre in Coventry, weekly drop in service; Monday at Bosnia House; Wednesday at St.Peters Centre in Coventry; in community languages offering support on housing, Welfare Benefit Rights, Health and community Care; We are happy that we managed to reach the Roma community in Birmingham and Coventry helping them with educational, social, housing and immigration issues; Over the reporting period we organised several social events where Roma community members and Bosnian community groups from Derby, Manchester, Coventry, Hertfordshire and London attended; All above activities were set up and delivered with great contributions from our volunteers that were recruited from our community and majority of them are also service users.

We have had around 220 older people attending social activities in Birmingham and Coventry. By or

ganising specific events for older members of our community with socialising, storytelling, food, soft drinks, tea & coffee we have improved great deal their mental health and their wellbeing; various activities for all generations that enabled us to reach over 540 families promoting involvement in our culture, physical activity and social independence. Families attending these events, their independence, mental and social life has vastly improved; this gives them opportunity share experience, socialise and speak their mother tongue language. Some of them act as unregistered carers as they look after older family members; we provided culturally appropriate counselling to 52 carers. They are carers within families who help disabled and in poor health members of the family who do not speak English. These carers benefited from our activities including social activities, peer group support, trips and sports. Improved facilities in Bosnia house enabled us to run parallel activities; During the reporting period we had support from 22 volunteers in organising activities in our community centre, 8 of them being elderly and/

or disabled. They helped us with setting up rooms for social gatherings, printing materials, keeping record of people attending our activities, video recording of the events/workshops; attending our steering group meetings etc..

COVID-19 has not stopped us working and helping our community members, especially vulnerable people who needed our help through this pandemic. Although Bosnia House had to close due Covid-19, the staff continued to work from home. We ensured that our community members had been informed about the latest measures from the British Government through regular telephone calls our website, facebook and twitter, and our official newsletter. Also, we managed to post masks and gloves to our members throughout the UK.

There are a number of very useful lessons that we learned through the project that could be helpful to any organisation that have an interest in helping members of our society; We are proud that we

managed to organise so many activities including social gatherings, networking, and peer group activities with grate commitment from our staff and volunteers. During the reporting period, we kept our members informed by regularly updating our fb and website as well as regular telephone contact.

We share our experience with local regional and national organisations that help us to deliver planned activities, such as community organisations in the region, voluntary councils, NHS, Victim support, Healing Hands Network... Also, during the reporting period we were invited to present our work and development of our organisation at two regional conferences:

- West Midlands Funders Network Conference (January 2019) attended by over 110 delegates from 42

organisations based in West Midlands area.

-Community fund- England Leadership team (February 2019).

We were grateful to have an opportunity to present our work at such important events.

Many of our activities are now more family orientated. These family oriented activities resulted in increased attendance and have better impact on mental and physical health of our beneficiaries; We have learned so much from our monitoring and evaluation to see where we can improve and what needs to be changed for our future references in regards to this project. We get clients from other communities asking advice in drop in sessions and we do try to help them when we can. Otherwise we advise them what relevant departments to go to.

The main priority over the coming period is to secure further funding to continue providing support to the most vulnerable members of the society and improving facilities in Bosnia House that will enable us to provide much needed services for the benefit of our community; Support local community and other organisations that use Bosnia House for their activities, find the best methods to deliver services during pandemic period, including introduction of new services and adaptation of the present one following the government rules regarding social distance and other measures regarding COVID19. That will also

include adaptation of facilities in Bosnia House, increase ICT capacity and commitment to us digital opportunities to help us provide a service to the communities we serve House.



OUR RESPONSE TO COVID19

The COVID19 has not stopped us working & helping our community members, especially elderly and disabled. We know they are in vulnerable group and they need help during this difficult and very worrying time.

We were very concerned of their well being and how will they cope through this pandemic. There are lots of very isolated elderly individuals who have no one to help them.

Because of the precaution we have closed the Bosnia House and we have informed members of our community and other organisations that use our centre;

- We have continued to work from home.
- Official brochure on the virus and instructions from the British government to let a non-English-speaking family know what precautionary measures are
- Official newsletter called Bilten was also done.
- We are regularly informing our community members of latest measures from the British Government through the website, fb and twitter, and our official newsletter.
- We made sure that we order big bulk of masks and gloves. One of our colleagues was allocated to post them to those that were needed. We can say that this



activity was very successful as lots of masks and gloves were sent through different parts of UK.

-We have also allocated one of our colleagues to implement measures of calling twice per week elderly members of our community in West Midlands just to see if they are ok, if they need anything and how are they coping in lockdown & what is their mental well being. We have noticed that in few clients their mental well-being has deteriorated so we tend to call them every other day just to make sure they are ok.

-We have help line open 24 hours so anyone can call and if they have any problems they can speak to one of our members to help them out.

-Also one of our workers still helps clients over the phone or online to fill in benefit forms or speak to benefit departments on their behalf.

-Lots of elderly clients can not go to GP surgeries so one of our colleagues calls POS (prescription ordering service) to order medicine for them and get them delivered to their home address.

The Association aims to build up reserves to cover 6 months operating costs in the event of a drop in income. Unrestricted Reserves held as at March 31st 2020 were £25,363.



Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of the Bosnia and Herzegovina UK Network



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2020

1. Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies adopted, judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty in the preparation of the financial statements are as follows:

Charity information

Bosnia and Herzegovina UK Network is a registered charity. The charity's registered office is Bosnia House, 36 Medley Road, Birmingham, B11 2NE. At the end of the year there were 8 Trustees.

1.1 Accounting convention

These accounts have been prepared in accordance with FRS 102, "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" ("FRS 102"), "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" the Statement of Recommended Practice for charities applying FRS 102, the Companies Act 2006 and UK Generally Accepted Accounting Practice as it applies from 1 January 2015. The charity is a Public Benefit Entity as defined by FRS 102.

The accounts are prepared in Sterling which is the functional currency of the charity. Monetary amounts in these financial statements to the nearest £.

The accounts have been prepared on historical cost convention apart from freehold property that is carried at market value. The principal accounting policies adopted are set out below.

These are accounts for the year ended 31 March 2020 are the first accounts of Bosnia and Herzegovina UK Network prepared in accordance with FRS 102, The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland.

1.2 Going concern

At the time of approving the accounts, the trustees have a reasonable expectation that the charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus the Trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the accounts.

1.3 Charitable Funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the trustees for particular purposes.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal.

1.4 Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the SOFA when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. Gifts in kind have been included at market value of gifts received and in assets acquired. No amounts are included in the financial statements for services donated by volunteers.

1.5 Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs relating to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with use of the resources. Fund-raising costs are those incurred in seeking voluntary contributions and do not include the costs of disseminating information in the support of the charitable activities.

1.6 Debtors

Trade and other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount due after any trade discounts offered. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid net of any trade discounts due.

1.7 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities.

1.8 Creditors and provisions

Creditors and provisions are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors and provisions are normally recognised at their settlement amount after allowing for any trade discounts due.

1.9 Financial instruments

The charity has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at transaction value and subsequently measured at their settlement value.

Derecognition of financial liabilities

Financial liabilities are derecognised when the charity's contractual obligations expire or are discharged or cancelled.

1.10 Employee benefits

The cost of any unused holiday entitlement is recognised in the period in which the employee's services are received.

Termination benefits are recognised immediately as an expense when the charity is demonstrably committed to terminate the employment of an employee or to provide termination benefits.

1.11 Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on income and gains falling within section 505 of the Taxes Act 1988 or section 252 of the Taxation of Chargeable Gains Act 1992 to the extent that these are applied to its charitable objects.

1.12 Depreciation
